



Community Bursary Case Study

Kaim Court Tenants Allotment Project

- Organisation:** Kaim Court Tenants Allotment Project
- Aim:** The allotment project was set up solely for the Kaim Court tenants, a group of 17 adults with learning disabilities living in supported tenancies, to encourage an outdoor activity and a new hobby,
- Bursary amount:** £1,000
- Spend:** The money has been spent on allowing the group to buy the remainder of slabs needed for allotment access. It has also allowed the tenants to buy gardening equipment for the allotment and a shed to store it in, seeds, wheelbarrow, tools as well as much needed kneeling cushions.

The bursary has enabled the tenants to become actively involved in the allotment. Less able tenants have benefited from spectating and supervising the workers. Relationships have been formed with other allotment owners. All tenants have benefited from fresh air, exercise and the chance to grow and eat their own produce.

Without the bursary, the creation of the allotment would not have been possible. Despite an abundance of rain in July, the allotment has the potential to have a productive 2010.
